
Papers on all geographic topics are accepted. Workshops, organized paper sessions, thematic discussion panels and posters are also being accepted for the meeting. Please contact the meeting chair if you are interested in running a workshop or special session. Paper presentations are limited to 15 minutes; abstracts of a maximum of 150 words should be submitted with registration. **Meeting registration will begin on September 15th**. We strongly encourage you to submit your abstracts and registration on-line at our web site (www.thepgs.org). **We can accept credit card payments on-line via PayPal.** Paper submissions are only accepted until October 15th! No exceptions!



All undergraduate and graduate students are welcome and are eligible to compete in the Student Paper Contest. Students can also submit a map, poster or an electronic (computer/web-based) map for consideration in the annual Elaine Bosowski Map Contest. More details about the student competitions and the judging criteria to be used can be found on the PGS website (http://thepgs.org/awards/awards.php). Cash prizes will be awarded to the best student presenters. On Friday afternoon, geographic educators have planned a workshop for middle and high school teachers. Highlights include an example of an integrative unit for students around geography and social studies issues; working with GIS (geographic information systems) directly on-line with browser-based investigation of the spatial factors of a topic; and seeing geography in the social studies curriculum as well as a STEM ingredient. It is an opportunity for networking with other teachers, of Delaware and Maryland, and for sharing sources and data for geographic lessons. The annual luncheon will be held in the Wicomico Room of the University Center on the Salisbury University campus. MADAAG has arranged a keynote speaker, electoral geographer **Dr. Gerald Webster** from the University of Wyoming, to give a talk on the U.S. presidential election which will take place the following Tuesday (Nov. 5). Dr. Webster is a prominent American electoral geographer who has published more than 75 research articles and book chapters on topics including gerrymandering, iconography, redistricting, electoral law, and southern politics. The Friday night banquet will be held Ward Museum of Wildfowl Art (http://www.wardmuseum.org/) in Salisbury, MD. A cash bar will also be provided. This year's banquet speaker is the 2012 PGS Distinguished Geographer Award winner. On Saturday morning, MADAAG will be hosting its annual Geography Bowl, while the local arrangement committee is offering a field trip to the Furnace Town Living Heritage Museum near Snow Hill, MD (http://www.furnacetown.com) on Saturday afternoon.
